### Cervical Cancer Screening & Vaccination

Cervical cancer is a type of cancer that forms in the cervix of a uterus. Cervical cancer is the cause of death for around 2,900 women nationwide every year, and around 1,000 women have their uterus removed by their thirties due to cancer treatment.

#### Prevention Starts Now

##### •Vaccination

Women born between April 2, 1997 to April 1, 2009 may receive free vaccination by March 31, 2025. In order to receive all three vaccinations within the timeframe, persons must start vaccinations by mid-September.

##### •Cervical Cancer Screening

Women who are over 20 years old can receive a cervical cancer screening once every two years (in the fiscal year in which they are an even-numbered age), for 1,700 yen.

### Protect Yourself from Clothing-Related Fire Accidents!

Whether for barbecues or fireworks, summertime sees an increase in how much we use fire. Be sure to watch out for accidents in which clothes may catch on fire.

#### Real-Life Cases that Led to Fires:

- Clothing catching on fire while reaching for something at the back of the gas stove
- Candles lit for fireworks igniting clothing



#### Key Points to Prevent Clothing-Related Fire Accidents:

- Do not keep condiments, etc. behind or toward the back of your gas stove.
- Be mindful of sleeves or cuffs/hems so that they do not touch any open flames.
- Use nonflammable items when working with or near fire.
- Keep a household fire extinguisher on hand should a fire break out.

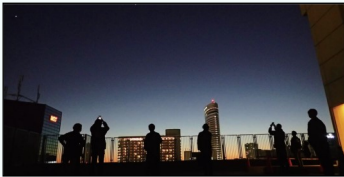
